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BY THE NUMBERS

A MESSAGE FROM INTERACT DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVE ANTHONY MASI:

Hi everyone! I'd like to thank every club that submitted the Interact Club Update Form over the past few weeks. With your help, the district is able to better assess the needs of D7980 Interact clubs and track progress towards long term goals.

For the first time in years, we have been able to calculate district membership data for the Interact program, which I have shared with you below.

- 4 counties make up District 7980: Fairfield, New Haven, Middlesex, and New London.
- 59 Interact clubs in District 7980 have an active charter.
- 46 of those clubs are operational and have an active member base.
- 35 have completed the 2015-16 club update form.

The following statistics are based on the 35 clubs that submitted their club information:

- 1023 is the number of known Interactors in District 7980 (out of the 35 clubs).
- 333 (32.7%) are male, ages 12 -18
- 690 (68.3%) are female, ages 12 -18
- 27.7 is the average number of members per club.
- 19 is the median number of members per club
- 113 is the membership of the largest club.
- 5 is the membership of the smallest club.
- 15 is the recommended membership before chartering a new Interact club.

BREAKOUT GROUP ACTIVITY:

Scenario:

After reviewing the Interact Citation criteria, your club has decided to pursue a collaborative project with another club. Your club board is beginning to form a timeline of events for the following school year, and would like you to present a proposal for a collaborative project in the fall of 2015. You have the option to either aid another club in adopting one of your projects, or to work together with another club to establish a new project.

Task:

You will organize evenly into breakout groups and draft a proposal for a collaborative project. You will have 20 minutes to develop:

- 1. A specific project which two or more Interact clubs will collaborate to complete in the fall of 2015
- 2. A two minute presentation with the purpose of sharing your proposed project with the rest of your Interact club
- 3. A poster to complement your presentation

Be sure to:

- provide a description of the proposed project
- outline specific goals and timeframes
- itemize resources needed for project completion
- establish benchmarks to evaluate the completion of your goals
- be creative and consider tangible goals for implementation

2014-15 ROTARY DISTRICT 7980 CITATIONS FOR INTERACT CLUBS

Every year, Rotary International District 7980 issues citations to deserving Interact clubs to recognize their achievements and efforts over the past year. Achieving a district citation reflects an Interact club's ability to represent the local and international communities of Rotary, work together with their sponsoring Rotary club(s), and engage their members at the district level. The three district citations offered by Rotary International District 7980 are summarized below. The specific criteria for each citation is outlined on the back of the sheet.

- 1. **The Interact Citation (level 1, 5 criteria):** is awarded to Interact clubs that meet the minimum requirements set forth by the Interact District 7980 Executive Committee.
- 2. The Youth Service Citation (level 2, 8 criteria): is awarded to Interact clubs that complete the minimum requirements, as well as involve themselves in other programs listed under Rotary's fifth Avenue of Service (Youth Service).
- 3. **The District Governor's Citation (level 3, 12 criteria):** is awarded to Interact clubs that not only complete the minimum requirements and involve themselves in Youth Service programs, but also go above and beyond in representing the local and international communities of Rotary.

Use the back of this sheet to plan and report Interact accomplishments for the 2014-15 Rotary year. An Interact club is eligible for a district citation if they have fulfilled every requirement for that citation. All activities must be completed between July 1, 2014, and March 31, 2015.

To apply for a district citation, the qualifying Interact club should have the bottom of this sheet signed by their Interact club president, Interact club adviser, and sponsoring Rotary club president(s). The signed form should then be scanned and emailed to <u>InteractClubsD7980@gmail.com</u> no later than Tuesday, March 31, 2015.

1 Hold regular, full-club meetings at least twice per month.		
2 Identify and report Interact club officers for the 2015-2016 year to the Interact Executive Committee no later than February 1, 2015.		
3 Carry out a school or community service project/ fundraiser to support one of Rotary's six areas of focus.		
4 Engage your club at the district level of Interact by sending members to at least two Interact District functions (including Interact District Assemblies, and/or ICoP's)		
5 Collaborate with your sponsoring Rotary club(s) on at least one project and have your Interact club officers attend at least one Rotary club meeting.		
6 Send club members to Rotary leadership conferences, such as Next Generations and/or RYLA		
7 Participate in the Rotary District 7980 Interact-Rotaract joint service project.		
8 Introduce your members to other Youth Service opportunities (like RYLA, Next Generations, and Rotaract) through a presentation by a past participant.		
9 Educate others about Interact by offering a presentation to a Rotary club, school, or other community organization currently without an Interact club.		
10 Participate in at least one acivity that promotes international understanding.		
11 Organize a joint project with another Early Act, Interact, and/or Rotaract club.		
12 Organize a joint project with one of Rotary's partners, like the Boy Scouts of America.		





2014-15 PRESIDENTIAL CITATION FOR INTERACT CLUBS

How does your Interact club make a difference? Use this form to plan and report Interact accomplishments for the 2014-15 Rotary year. To qualify for the Presidential Citation, Interact clubs must carry out activities, listed below, in order to score at least **35 points**. All activities must be completed between 1 July 2014 and 31 March 2015.

In addition, the Interact club must have an active status with Rotary International. Before completing this form, the president of the sponsor Rotary club must confirm that status by checking the New Generations Clubs report in Rotary Club Central. The president then signs the form to certify the Interact club's achievements and sends it to the district governor, who must receive it by 31 March 2015. **This form should not be sent to Rotary International, as it will not be processed.**

District governors must report the names of the qualifying Interact clubs in their districts through My Rotary by 15 April 2015.

ACTIVITIES

- Participate in a local or district Rotary Day event (consult the *Rotary Days* brochure for information) or other Rotary event. (15 points)
- □ Participate in at least one activity that promotes international understanding. (15 points)
- Introduce your members to other Rotary opportunities for young leaders, such as RYLA, Youth Exchange, or Rotaract.
 (10 points)
- □ Participate in a fundraiser to support polio eradication. (10 points)
- □ Submit a video for the Interact Video Contest. (10 points)
- □ Participate in a school or community service project or fundraiser to support one of Rotary's areas of focus. (10 points)
- □ Collaborate with one of Rotary's service partners, such as YSA. (5 points)
- □ Participate in a career day or mentoring activity. (5 points)
- □ Recommend an outbound Interactor who then joins a Rotaract club. (10 points)
