They are encouraged to attend the bimonthly meetings, which will rotate venues throughout the district.

BREAKOUT GROUP ACTIVITY:

Scenario:

It is mid December and your Interact club continues to experience declining membership. Last year, many of your club's dedicated members were high school seniors, and have since graduated. This year, your club's membership consists of 2 sophomores, 4 juniors, and 2 seniors. Due to a miscommunication, your Interact club missed the deadline to reserve a table at your school's club fair. No freshmen have expressed interest in joining your club. The school administration, who pays a stipend to your faculty adviser, has taken notice of your Interact club's declining membership. In a meeting with the faculty adviser and the club president, the administration has threatened to shut down the club unless it attracts 10 new members in the next two months and differentiates itself from the Key Club at your school.

Task:

You will organize evenly into breakout groups and form your own Interact club for this activity. You will have 25 minutes to develop:

- 1. A detailed strategy to increase club membership,
- 2. A two minute presentation with the purpose of convincing school administrators to keep the Interact club.

Be sure to:

- outline specific goals and timeframes
- establish benchmarks to evaluate the completion of these goals
- address the specific concerns of school administrators
- identify resources your Interact club will utilize to increase membership
- identify methods of retaining members and promoting sustainable club growth

Your Interact club will construct a poster and give a 2 minute presentation to the group outlining your plan. Be creative, and use your past experiences to guide your thinking.

* Your ability to hold on to current club members and bring in new ones is essential to your club's success. To keep members coming back, involve them in club activities and encourage them to take on club leadership roles. To help your club grow, bring in members with special interests and abilities who are enthusiastic about the social and service aspects of Interact. *

Consider these suggestions for maintaining a strong, committed membership:

Set goals. Set membership goals and encourage all club members to work to meet them. For example, challenge members to bring in one new Interactor each year, and offer an award or prize to the member who recruits the most new members.

Keep current members. Keeping active club members is just as important as gaining new ones. With a large number of enthusiastic, dedicated members, your club will be better able to carry out successful service projects and attract new members.

STRATEGIES FOR INVOLVING NEW MEMBERS


- Hold a special meeting or event to welcome and celebrate new club members.
- Explain the opportunities and benefits that come with Interact membership. Members who understand Interact and its purpose are more likely to remain active in the club.
- Ask experienced Interactors to "adopt" new members and make them feel welcome.

STRATEGIES FOR INVOLVING ESTABLISHED MEMBERS

- Assign committee responsibilities to veteran member to let them know they're important to the club.
- Recognize club members who dedicate extra time to service projects.
- Maintain a good age and gender balance. Different points of view contribute to a richer Interact experience.
- Get feedback from members on the types of meetings, activities, and projects <u>they enjoy</u>.

- Plan social events to bring members closer together.
- Monitor attendance to ensure everyone comes to at least 60 percent of the club's meetings. Members with high attendance are the most likely to stay involved.
- Keep members informed through a club newsletter, distributed either in print or electronically. Mention service projects and fundraising efforts, news from Rotarv International, Interact club leadership reports, a brief summary of club meetings, and sponsor Rotary club activities that may interest Interactors. Include the name and address of the Interact club, its meeting time and place, the name of the sponsor Rotarv club, and the Rotary district number in your newsletter.





BRINGING IN NEW MEMBERS

-Let them know we are here!-


- Emphasize the club's service efforts and successes, the internationality of Interact, and the opportunity for members to take on leadership roles while having fun and making new friends.
- Publicize your club's activities in the school newspaper and local media.
- Invite potential members to participate in a service project or attend a club meeting so that they see Interact in action.
- Develop a club web site (facebook) where potential members can learn about Interact club projects and find out how to join. Ask you school to include a link to your club's site on its web site.
- Arrange for Interact displays at local libraries, coffee shops, community centers, or anywhere else youth gather.













2014-15 ROTARY DISTRICT 7980 CITATIONS FOR INTERACT CLUBS

Every year, Rotary International District 7980 issues citations to deserving Interact clubs to recognize their achievements and efforts over the past year. Achieving a district citation reflects an Interact club's ability to represent the local and international communities of Rotary, work together with their sponsoring Rotary club(s), and engage their members at the district level. The three district citations offered by Rotary International District 7980 are summarized below. The specific criteria for each citation is outlined on the back of the sheet.

- 1. **The Interact Citation (level 1, 5 criteria):** is awarded to Interact clubs that meet the minimum requirements set forth by the Interact District 7980 Executive Committee.
- 2. **The Youth Service Citation (level 2, 8 criteria):** is awarded to Interact clubs that complete the minimum requirements, as well as involve themselves in other programs listed under Rotary's fifth Avenue of Service (Youth Service).
- 3. **The District Governor's Citation (level 3, 12 criteria):** is awarded to Interact clubs that not only complete the minimum requirements and involve themselves in Youth Service programs, but also go above and beyond in representing the local and international communities of Rotary.

Use the back of this sheet to plan and report Interact accomplishments for the 2014-15 Rotary year. An Interact club is eligible for a district citation if they have fulfilled every requirement for that citation. All activities must be completed between July 1, 2014, and March 31, 2015.

To apply for a district citation, the qualifying Interact club should have the bottom of this sheet signed by their Interact club president, Interact club adviser, and sponsoring Rotary club president(s). The signed form should then be scanned and emailed to <u>InteractClubsD7980@gmail.com</u> no later than <u>Tuesday</u>, March 31, 2015.

To qualify for the Presidential Citation, Interact clubs must carry out activities, listed below, in order to score at least **35 points**. All activities must be completed between 1 July 2014 and 31 March 2015.

In addition, the Interact club must have an active status with Rotary International. Before completing this form, the president of the sponsor Rotary club must confirm that status by checking the New Generations Clubs report in Rotary Club Central. The president then signs the form to certify the Interact club's achievements and sends it to the district governor, who must receive it by 31 March 2015. **This form should not be sent to Rotary International, as it will not be processed.**

District governors must report the names of the qualifying Interact clubs in their districts through My Rotary by 15 April 2015.

- Participate in a local or district Rotary Day event (consult the *Rotary Days* brochure for information) or other Rotary event.

- □ Participate in at least one activity that promotes international understanding. **(15 points)**
- Introduce your members to other Rotary opportunities for young leaders, such as RYLA, Youth Exchange, or Rotaract.
 (10 points)
- □ Participate in a fundraiser to support polio eradication. (10 points)
- □ Submit a video for the Interact Video Contest. (10 points)
- □ Participate in a school or community service project or fundraiser to support one of Rotary's areas of focus. (10 points)
- □ Collaborate with one of Rotary's service partners, such as YSA. (5 points)
- □ Participate in a career day or mentoring activity. (5 points)
- □ Recommend an outbound Interactor who then joins a Rotaract club. (10 points)
